Additional Information

- No more than 10 introductory courses are to be completed - with the exception of the Accounting specialisation where 12 introductory courses can be counted.
- All courses have a value of 15 credit points, unless otherwise specified. Students must complete 480 credit points.
- No more than 4 general elective courses from other FedUni schools are to be completed.
- While students are encouraged to complete more, a minimum of 10 level three courses (3500-3700 range) are to be completed across the double degree program.
- This program structure applies to students commencing from 2018. Students who commenced prior to 2018 should contact the Undergraduate Administrator for appropriate checklist and program information.
