You must complete all core compulsory courses within the program structure over 3 years (or part-time equivalent), unless you are eligible to transfer into the pathway entry program* (see below). Each course is usually 15 credit points.

A total of 360 credit points is compulsory to satisfy the program requirements of initial teacher Bachelor of Education programs.

*Successful completion of at least one year of the TC5 program may qualify (pending School approval) interested students for transfer into TX5 Bachelor of Education (P-10). Once eligibility has been assessed, students can then apply for credit transfer.
