As you are aware, we are preparing to commence online delivery of our higher education programs from Monday 30 March. While teaching activities are paused this week, our university staff are working hard to ensure we can continue to provide you with a high quality teaching and learning experience in these challenging times.

This email contains helpful information about how online teaching and learning will work, as well as updates on the university's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Practical sessions and labs

Following further review of higher education programs that require face-to-face delivery, practical sessions and labs have now been deferred for the rest of the semester. The Arts Academy programs that require face-to-face contact such as performing arts, acting, music theatre, communication design, ceramics, visual and fine arts will be transitioned to a limited online delivery from Monday 30 March and will no longer be taught face-to-face. Please speak to your course coordinator if you have any questions about this.

Census date

We understand online learning will be new for many of our students and we want to make sure you have time to make sure it is right for you. Therefore we will be extending the census date from Tuesday 31 March to Thursday 30 April. This means you have until **Thursday 30 April** to change your enrolment without facing any academic or financial penalty.
