> The introduction of an SI grade (studies impacted)

An SI (Studies Impacted) grade will be issued in place of a fail grade*, where you are enrolled in a Northern Hemisphere Semester 2 (Term code 2003) course but have not received an overall passing grade. This will happen automatically, and you do not need to do anything further regarding this grade. Please note that the SI grade will not be used towards the calculation of your GPA.

> Grade Point Average (GPA) allowances

This semester you will have the opportunity to remove your Northern Hemisphere Semester 2 (Term code 2003) results* from your GPA calculation, on an 'opt-in' basis. Your results will still appear on your academic transcript, however they will not impact your GPA. Further information will be provided on our <u>GPA webpage</u> in

the coming weeks. This will include how to calculate the effect this will on your GPA and the process you need to follow if you wish to have this applied.

We wish you the very best with any end-of-semester assessments you may have, and then we hope you can enjoy some well-deserved down time.
