COVID-19 Incident Notice

Dear Student,

Federation University Australia's must advise that unfortunately we have had a staff member at the Wimmera Campus test positive to COVID-19.

The campus is now closed for deep cleaning. Please do not come to class until we notify you when it is safe to reopen.

The staff member had attended the campus over the past 14 days but it is unclear whether they had symptoms of COVID-19 at the time of attendance. They are now in self-isolation for the next 14 days.

We are notifying all of our Wimmera based staff and students. External contractors who may have been on campus over this same period are also being identified and contacted.

Who must get tested and self-isolate?

The Victorian Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) has been notified immediately to commence contact tracing.

DHHS will begin contact tracing following privacy legislation to protect the identity of staff and students. If DHHS need to contact you, please remember it will be via a private number. If you have any symptoms of COVID-19 (sore throat, cold, fever or difficulty breathing), you should get tested immediately and self-isolate until you receive your test result. You can use the <u>coronavirus interactive self-assessment</u> on the DHHS website for guidance, if you have any symptoms.

Federation University COVID-19 hotline for reporting

If you are confirmed or suspected of having COVID-19, you must report it as follows.

During business hours: call the COVID-19 hotline on (03) 5122 6300.

Outside business hours: call the **Emergency phone number 1800 333 732** for confirmed cases (positive test result). Call the COVID-19 hotline for suspected cases and negative COVID-19 test results (leave a message to be followed up the next morning).
