This contract notification is to advise you about the release of the draft 2026 VET funding contracts and guidelines, and the approved course lists for 2026.

Release of the draft 2026 VET funding contracts and guidelines

We have published the following in the documents section of SVTS:

- Draft 2026 TAFE VET funding contract
- Draft 2026 dual sector VET funding contract
- Draft 2026 standard VET funding contract
- Draft 2026 guidelines about eligibility
- Draft 2026 guidelines about fees
- Draft 2026 guidelines about apprenticeship/traineeship training delivery
- Draft 2026 Skills First quality charter.

We've also published associated guides to help you understand the changes to the contract.

Minor contract changes for 2026

You now don't have to create a separate 'statement of fees' – unless you want to. You can provide information about fees in other ways, such as on an invoice.

You now must tell prospective students if their program has a practical placement.

We also clarified some of our requirements. For example:

- Students under 17 years of age don't need an exemption from school if they've completed year 12 or an equivalent qualification.
- We updated the requirements for delivering school-based apprenticeships and traineeships.

2026 course lists

We've published the 2026 training needs list and 2026 funded programs report in the documents section of SVTS.

2026 training needs list

The 2026 list reflects the Victorian Government's overall policy for its investment in the Skills First program. We subsidise training in the highest priority areas where there is a strong rationale for public subsidy within available budget.

The training needs list states the enrolment type, program category and associated occupations and industries for each program we fund.

We've removed 95 programs from the training needs list.

The programs we removed are listed in attachment 1.

We removed these programs because there has been no or low demand for them, or poor outcomes. We made these decisions at a program level across the market and not at an individual training provider level.

From 2026 you can't deliver these programs to new students under Skills First. However, you can train continuing students in these programs, and we will pay you the Skills First subsidy until they complete their training.

2026 funded programs report

The funded programs report outlines the programs that can get Skills First funding and their subsidy rates.

In 2026, subsidy rates will continue to depend on the type of training provider, delivery location, delivery method, and program type. We kept subsidy rates the same as 2025. However, we increased the subsidy rate for the Certificate I in Developing Independence.

If you are a TAFE, dual sector university or community-based provider, rate 1 in column J of the funded programs report applies. For all other training providers, go to the funded programs report and regional postcodes tab to find what subsidy rate applies to your delivery – either rate 1 (in column J), rate 2a (column K) or rate 2b (column K).

2026 Free TAFE list

We removed 2 mental health short courses from the Free TAFE course list due to low student demand and no current delivery of the training.

- Mental Health Co-Existing Needs Skill Set
- Mental Health Peer Work Skill Set.

Superseding programs in a training package

For programs from a training package, unless we tell you otherwise, we will automatically add the new version of the program to your funded scope when its put on both:

- your scope of registration, as identified on training.gov.au, and
- the 2026 funded programs report.

For VET accredited programs, please contact us via SVTS once:

- the regulator adds the replacement version of the program to your scope of registration, and
- the department has added it to the funded programs report.

We will then add the new version to your funded scope and send you an updated schedule 2 – individual details and conditions.
