## Course Requirements

The course is primarily offered in a blended learning approach with students expected to attend 2- hour face to face active learning workshops (tutorial) and complete some activities online.

Accreditation with the Australian Community Workers Association (ACWA) has been granted to this course. Upon completion, students will be eligible to apply for ACWA membership.

This course has a field placement component throughout the duration of the course.

Students must satisfactorily complete 360 credit points in order to qualify for the Bachelor of Community and Human Services. Each Unit within the course is typically worth 15 credit points, with the exception of the CHSUG3005 Field placement unit worth 45 credit points.

Students must complete 1 core Indigenous course. Students can choose to complete the course in Semester 1 or Semester 2 of the program. Students can undertake either a minor course or an elective in the semester they do not take the alternative Indigenous studies core.

## Minor Specialisation

Students will have 5 minor areas of study to choose from: Criminal Justice, Sociology, Indigenous Studies, Behavioural Studies, and Education. Students taking a minor in one of these disciplines will complete 4 units from the specific discipline they have chosen for their minor.

Note: Only one discipline area can be chosen to complete the minor sequences: i.e., Criminal Justice OR Sociology OR Indigenous Studies OR Behavioural Studies OR Education.

## Glossary

<b>Co-requisite (CoR):</b>	A unit or units that must be completed concurrently with the chosen unit
<b>Pre-requisite (PR):</b>	A unit or units that must be completed prior to undertaking another unit
<b>Exclusion(s) (EX):</b>	A unit that is the equivalent to another unit & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent unit
<b>Introductory (Intro):</b>	Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units
<b>Intermediate (Inter.):</b>	Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units
<b>Advanced (Adv.):</b>	Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units
<b>Major/Minor:</b>	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
<b>Semester:</b>	Designated teaching period
<b>CR:</b>	Credit Point value
