### 2.2 Direction of IoC Working Party

As discussed at the previous meeting, issues related to staffing and workloads have impeded progress on the implementation of the four objectives from University Strategy 1.1. The following were discussed as well as the logistics of implementing the objectives.

a) Talia, Kim and Deb met with Todd Walker on 3<sup>rd</sup> October to seek advice on how these issues could be overcome. The following suggestions emerged from this discussion:

\*Dissolve IoC Working Party. Set up a Steering Committee with membership from Associate Deans, CUP, CLIPP, Student Connect. Terms of Reference are the four objectives. Provide quarterly reports (via Chair of Academic Board) to International Partners Committee (IPC). Todd offered to be Executive Sponsor.

b) Talia also met with Nina Fotinatos on 10<sup>th</sup> October to discuss CLIPP's involvement in implementing the objectives and the following suggestions emerged from that discussion:

\* Re-form IoC Working Party to become *IoC Professional Development Group* (or other appropriate title). Membership could consist of people who want to lead and have the specific skills to develop and implement the IoC objectives. The objectives can be identified as projects with specific timelines allocated. CLIPP will provide support to implement Objectives 2 - 4. Provide milestone dates to report to International Partners Committee (IPC). Todd could still be Executive Sponsor (to be confirmed). Terms of Reference to reflect the four objectives.

### **Future direction**

The IoC Working Party recognises that the group's Terms of Reference have been fulfilled and that from this point onwards, different group/s will be formed to implement the above objectives.

### Recommendation

\*The IoC Working Party requests that Academic Board receives the final report of the IoC and dissolves the IoC Working Party.
