

2019 Minor & Elective Options

Bachelor of Psychological Science (BPsychSci) – HY5

(Mt Helen, Churchill, Berwick, and Online Offerings)

What are minors and electives?

Minors

A minor is a group of courses (sometimes called a 'stream') that you must complete as part of your program. However, not all programs have minors. In HY5, whether or not your program has a minor, and how many courses that minor includes, depends on the first year of your enrolment (see below for your year).

You need to enrol yourself into each of your minor courses, and this document is intended to help with selecting courses by providing lists of minor possibilities.

Electives

An elective is any 15-credit point courses offered by the university. HY5 requires that you complete elective courses. Again this differs depending on the first year of enrolment (see below for your year). You can select all your electives from one sequence (e.g., Behavioural Studies or Criminal Justice), or a combination of courses from different areas. You can select your electives from the courses in these lists. Alternatively, each School in the university provides lists of courses offered, and you can select from those. You will find these lists on the website, under each of the schools, and in the student resources area.

Choosing minors and electives

The good news is that there are plenty of options to choose from for your minor and electives, and this gives you a great amount of flexibility with what you study. The bad news is that there are lots of courses, so choosing can be difficult, especially for electives.

When thinking about which electives to choose, you might wish to consider what you would like to do with your degree when you finish. For example, studying Behavioural Studies, or Criminal Justice, or Community and Human Services, or Exercise and Sports Science, might be valuable for your intended vocational pathway. If you are not sure which career direction you'd like to take, use the electives to explore topics and subjects that might be possible career pathways, or simply choose topics that interest you.

It is important to keep in mind that many courses (intermediate [coded 2000] or advanced courses [coded 3000]) have pre-requisites. These are courses you must do before enrolling, and this becomes more important in second year. Some courses also have exclusions. These are courses that prevent you from enrolling into another course. For example an exclusion for PSYCB 2105 is BEHAV 3004. If you have completed or are currently enrolled in BEHAV 3004, you are not permitted to enrol into PSYCB 2105.

New Students (enrolling for the first time in 2019 or later)

Your program structure consists of 17 core (prescribed) courses in psychology (270 credit points) and six elective courses (90 credit points). There is no minor. However you can select your elective courses from the courses listed in the minor lists below. Indeed, you can select all the courses in a minor sequence as electives if you like (just like creating your own 'minor').

Continuing Students (first time enrolment Semester 2, 2018)

Same structure and requirements as for new students (above)

Continuing Students (first time enrolment Semester 1, 2018, and 2017)

Students who enrolled in the in the HY5 for the first time in Semester 1 2018, or 2017, are required to complete 17 core courses in the psychology sequence (270 credit points), a minor of four courses (60 credit points), and two elective courses (30 credit points).

This document contains lists of possible minor sequences for these students. Please note that many courses are listed, but HY5 students will most likely only do introductory (coded 1000) and intermediate (coded 2000) courses as part of their minor in first year and second year, respectively.

Note also that students can take their minor sequence from any available sequence at the university, although this depends on the specific requirements of that sequence, and some sequences may not accept external students to do a minor with them. Students who would like to take a minor not listed in this document will need to identify the minor they would like to do, and email the details of this possible minor to the HY5 course coordinator (Dr Shaun Watson) to verify before enrolling. Please be aware that this can sometimes be difficult due to timetable clashes.

Continuing Students (first time enrolment 2016 and earlier)

Students who were enrolled for the first time prior to 2017 are required to complete a psychology major of 13 courses (195 credit points), a minor of 6 courses (90 credit points), and 5 elective courses (75 credit points).

For these students, a minor can be drawn from one or two discipline sequences (not all sequences have six courses, hence the option of completing a minor from two, but no more than two, sequences). The majority of these sequences are drawn from the Bachelor of Arts major sequences, and are listed in this document.

Notes for all students

- As delivery of the program to Berwick is new, the options for minors are limited at this stage, although students can take any online offerings
- Mt Helen and Churchill offerings may vary in how they are delivered. For example, they may be a combination of online and face-to-face components
- It is the students' responsibility to double check pre-requisites and exclusions
- The courses in each sequence may vary from year to year
