Program Requirements

Students must complete all the core compulsory courses within the program structure over 4 years (or part-time equivalent).

Each course is usually worth 15 credit points. A total of 480 credit points is compulsory to satisfy the program requirements of Initial Teacher Education (ITE) programs, as well as a minimum of 80 days professional experience. You will also be required to successfully complete external Literacy and Numeracy tests prior to registration as a teacher.

A **major** consists of six (6) subjects from a chosen discipline.

A **minor** consists of four (4) subjects from a chosen discipline.

Please note that International Students are not eligible to study this program online.

Students will need to apply for a Working with Children Check (WWCC) card before commencing their program. A copy of the WWCC card must be supplied to the University prior to commencing professional experience placements. More information can be found at the WWCC website.
