Starting with Federation

You will need books and access to a computer

We have scholarships and bursaries for books and technology - you may be surprised what you are eligible for!

Booklists

Your program is likely to have a booklist. Every book on a booklist is available in the library but for unlimited access to your own copy, purchase your own. Booklists are normally released in the 2 weeks prior to semester starting; view them <u>here</u>.

Computers

All students need access to a computer, a good internet connection and the right software for their assessments. Check the minimum IT requirements for study at Federation <u>here</u>.

If you are looking at purchasing a computer, check the discounts you are eligible for through the <u>University IT</u> <u>portal</u>, including a free download of Microsoft Office 365, and check if you are eligible for the <u>Coronavirus</u> <u>Special Assistance Scheme</u>.

Sign into your online learning portal

All the subjects (referred to as 'courses' at Fed) you have enrolled in will be available in our official learning management system, called Moodle.

Moodle is where your learning will take place - you will access your course materials and get all the information about your assignments and learning tasks. You will see who your lecturers are for each subject, and be able to find their contact details. and much more. You must click through to each of the courses you are enrolled in, read through each, and download your 'Course Descriptions'.

Need a hand? You can get support from within Moodle itself. Click the Study Help drop down, view the Moodle Guides, or under Login to select Student Support Forum and click 'Enrol Me' to participate in the support forums. Happy learning!

Coming on campus

Access to our campuses is currently restricted to essential staff, but we do offer a limited number of <u>bookable</u> <u>study spaces</u>, for students without computer access at home.

These managed learning spaces have been set up to meet the COVID-19 requirements of government.

Get your Student ID card

You'll need your ID card for many things during your time with Fed, which at the moment includes accessing the bookable on campus study spaces.

Plus it shows you are eligible for student discounts! Upload a photo of yourself in the <u>CaptureMe Portal</u>, and Student HQ will post your Student ID card out to you.

Library access

Our campus library buildings are closed to non-library staff, but you can still access library services and receive assistance from library staff – all online!

Access e-books, e-journals, research and digital skills training, copyright and course readings services and consultations. Plus you can have books posted to you – just use "Eligible for postal loans" as the pick-up location. We will even send you a reply paid address label so that the books can be returned safely.

Download the free <u>MyLibrary! app</u>, to easily search, request and renew Library items. You can also access the Library's social media channels for updates on news and events.

Get ready to communicate

Our most common form of communication with you will be email, so it is vital that you know how to access your Federation student email account.

All students automatically receive a student email account, which will appear as your 'preferred email' in My Student Centre. You can <u>add a different email address</u> to be your 'preferred', or you can <u>forward your</u> <u>Federation email</u> to an alternate account.

We also have a '<u>Communication Protocol</u>' that all of us - students and staff - must adhere to. Make sure you are familiar with these expectations, and understand your responsibilities in communicating with your peers, with staff and with the University.

Get the EDGE!

We are excited to introduce you to EDGE - designed to make it easier for you to manage your co-curricular involvement around Federation! Use it for help finding jobs, to get career advice, to start a club, to explore sporting opportunities, to apply for the Industry Placement Program... the list goes on! Plus you can get info about, and register for, the social events that we host, Federation club and society events, and for personal and professional development opportunities.
