Your statement to the student voters

Along with this form, you are required to submit either:

- a video statement (3 minutes max), transcript of the statement, and photo of yourself
 OR
- 2. a written statement (300 words max) and photo of yourself

In your statement we suggest you introduce yourself, identify relevant skills and experiences, and identify changes, issues, or ideas you wish to take up with the University during your term.



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The audience for your statement will be the student voters. These video or written statements and your photo will accompany the voting form sent to all students, should your application proceed to an election. Statements and photos may additionally be published on the FedUni website, University-affiliated social media, and on noticeboards around campus to promote the election and help students decide how to vote.

If you are applying for more than one position, we suggest you submit a different statement uniquely relevant to each position. (Remember: you must fill in a separate form for each application.)

If you fail to submit a statement and photo, your application will be deemed invalid and will not be counted.

Video Statement Guidelines

We suggest you try to speak naturally, imagining you are speaking to a real audience, and not read your statement from a page or screen. Your video should be no longer than three minutes. MP4 format video is preferred, but others will be accepted.

The message is more important than the quality, and you are welcome to record on your phone or whatever device is easiest for you. If you find the video is too big to attach to an email, you may provide a link. A service like www.wetransfer.com will allow you to easily share a large video file with the Returning Officer.

The transcript is a written version of what you say in your video. We will make this available alongside the video for accessibility. The transcript should match closely with what you say in your video.
