Program Requirements

Students must complete all the core compulsory courses within the program structure over 4 years (or part-time equivalent).

Students will also be required to complete a major and minor area of study.

Each course is usually worth 15 credit points.

A total of 480 credit points is compulsory to satisfy the program requirements of Initial Teacher Education (ITE) programs, as well as a minimum of 80 days professional experience. You will also be required to successfully complete external Literacy and Numeracy tests prior to registration as a teacher.

Please note that International Students are not eligible to study this program online.

Students will need to apply for a Working with Children Check (WWCC) card before commencing their program. A copy of the WWCC card must be supplied to the University prior to commencing professional experience placements. More information can be found at the WWCC website.

Minor Discipline Electives

It is a requirement that Pre-Service Teachers (PSTs) complete:

- One Major Studies of eight discipline elective courses
- One Minor Studies of four discipline elective courses

plus

- Two Curriculum courses in each Major and Minor area of study (for a total of 4 courses).
