A life beautifully lived deserves to be beautifully remembered

Kylie Pope passed away tragically following a car accident in 2020. Not only did her family grieve for her loss, but hundreds of families in the communities where she worked were heartbroken.

This is because Kylie was an early childhood educator and made a huge impact on children and their parents. She is remembered as the 'heart and soul' at the childcare centres where she worked. Kylie was passionate about creating a safe, happy and loving environment for children in her care. She always wanted the best for them and their parents.

Kylie was an inspiration and described as brilliant, caring, supportive and extremely passionate. One tribute said, 'I will never forget you Kylie – a mentor, friend, leader and beautiful human.'

This is the reason why Kylie's husband Peter Pope knew that he wanted to continue his wife's legacy.

Peter contacted Federation University Australia to find out how to organise a scholarship in her memory. He says 'They made it easy. They listened to what I wanted and guided me every step of the way. This year we offered our first scholarship to help a Fed Uni student studying Early Childhood Education. It makes us feel happy to know that Kylie's name will be remembered and at the same time help set the standard for children's learning and success.'

The scholarship is the perfect way to remember a life beautifully lived.

There was an outpouring of tributes for Kylie and the impact she had on the 'little people.' One mum wrote 'Kylie showed love and care for our children and always put their needs first.'

Not only did Kylie set a standard of excellence for supporting the development of children in her care, but she played a role in mentoring her workmates. One colleague remembers 'she made me the educator I am today.'







'With the scholarship I was able to buy a laptop. Honestly, it was the most lifesaving piece of equipment. If I didn't have it, I wouldn't be able to do the course.'

Phoebe

Like many others in our community, Phoebe struggled during COVID. She found it tough to juggle study, work and caring for her young son. At one stage, she didn't know if she would be able to continue her nursing studies.

'The daunting thing for everyone going to university is how they will afford it. I have sole responsibility for my young child. Usually, I work 30 hours per week as well as studying full time. The scholarship provided vital financial support so that I could reduce my work hours, focus on study and be an active part of my child's life. The scholarship has made a huge difference, I know will give us both a better life.'

A scholarship from the Federation University Foundation made it possible for Phoebe to keep her dream alive. It was the difference between giving up and continuing her studies.

There are many students just like Phoebe who need our support. This year alone, we were only able to help with 1 in 5 requests. A bequest is a gift that could be the difference for these students and one that has long lasting impact to individuals and the community.

I decided to become a donor because many Federation University students are the first in their families to go to university. 'From my time at the Australian Council for Educational Research, I knew that kids growing up in families where the parents are graduates are much more likely to go to uni themselves, and this is particularly the case when the mother is a graduate.

This scholarship is a deliberate contribution to inspiring that virtuous cycle, and I just love seeing the difference it makes to students and their families.'

Making a **bequest**

Leaving a gift in your will is one way to ensure your legacy lives on into the future.

After you have provided for your family and friends, you may wish to leave a gift to the Federation University Australia Foundation. A charitable bequest can take many forms, including:

Pecuniary bequest:

A fixed amount of money.

Gift in-kind:

A non-monetary donation, such as artworks, books or property.

Residual bequest:

The remainder (or residue) of your estate after all debts, charges and gifts have been deducted.

Percentage of residual bequest:

A percentage of the remainder of your estate after all debts, charges and gifts have been deducted.

Percentage bequest:

A predetermined percentage of your total estate.

Whatever gift you'd like to make, we take your wishes seriously.

You can choose exactly how you wish to direct your gift. This may be designating it to a specific area or project – such as student scholarships, research efforts, or the provision of state-of-the-art facilities – or to the area with the most vital need.

In making a bequest for a specific area it is important to discuss your plans with a member of the Foundation team to ensure your wishes can be fulfilled. We can also discuss how your donation may be appropriately recognised.

Wording your will

3 Wording for leaving a percentage of the total estate
