Course Rules

Note: Major Discipline Electives are subject to change depending on current unit offerings and are revised each year.

Major – a minimum of 6 units, 2 must be at least second year level (2000-2999) and 2 must be at least third year level (3000-3999)

Exceptions:

- Humanities Major – due to the broad range of subject areas in this field, the major comprises 6 history units and a “part” (two units only)

Minor – a minimum of 4 units – 2 must be at second year level (2000-2999) or above.

Exceptions:

- Humanities Minor – due to the broad range of subject areas in this field, the minor comprises 4 history units and a “part” (two units only)

Course Requirements

Students must complete all the core compulsory units within the course structure over 4 years (or part-time) equivalent).

Each unit is usually worth 15 credit points. A total of 480 credit points is compulsory to satisfy the course requirements of Initial Teacher Education (ITE) courses, as well as a minimum of 80 days professional experience. You will also be required to successfully complete external Literacy and Numeracy tests prior to registration as a teacher.

A major consists of six (6) subjects from a chosen discipline.

A minor consists of four (4) subjects from a chosen discipline.

Please note that international students are not eligible to study this course online.

Co-requisite (CoR):	A unit or units that must be completed concurrently with the chosen unit

Exclusion(s)(EX):	A unit that is the equivalent to another unit & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent unit
Introductory (Intro):	Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units
Intermediate (Inter.):	Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units
Advanced (Adv.):	Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units
