






Leslie Colin Blick

Died of wounds at Gallipoli on 29 April 1915, aged 20






Clifford Edgar Garrard

Killed 31 August 1918 in the attack on Clery-sur-Somme






Ernest D. Morshead


Ballarat Technical Art School Student

Returned to Australia 12 June 1919






Card sent to Daniel Walker (SMB) from Ray Blight. Note the pin holes from being displayed at the school.

Killed in Action on 28 June 1917

Enlisted into the Australian Mining Corp

Died 25 April 1917, along with 2 other Ballarat School of Mines Boys, after premature firing of a detonator

Enlisted Aus. Mining Corp Awarded Military Cross

Returned 1920





John Hewitson Smythe

Studied at SMB's Ballarat Technical Art School

Killed in Action in France on 06 April 1918 while being carried out wounded





William Kenneth (Ken) Moss


Ballarat Technical Art School Staff Member

Tree in the SMB Grounds planted for Frank Davis – the only Ballarat Junior Tech Boy to die during WW1.


The marble plaque is on the wall beside the tree.

Private William Allan Irwin DCM 1878 - 1.9.1918

Pte Irwin was 37 when he enlisted in the 33rd Battalion at Narrabri, NSW on 3 January 1916.

On 31 August 1918 the 33rd Battalion was attacking German positions at Road Wood when German machine gunners had the battalion pinned down and stopped the advance – Pte Irwin was mortally wounded and was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal (DCM) for his actions.

Pte Irwin is the only Aboriginal identified by CEW Bean in the Australian official history of the First World War and is buried in the Daours Communal Cemetery, near Corbie, France.




"School of Mines Arbor Day
