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


## What does BOLD mean?

Blended – a mix of Face-to-Face and online delivery

- On-Line Fully online delivery (or primarily online with 1-2 intensives)
- <u>Digital</u> Face-to-Face (or any) delivery that uses digital learning technologies

### The 'BOLD' development process (ADDIE)

## What are the myths about BOLD Delivery?

- Bright and shiny = learning
- Online is what 'techies' do, it has nothing to do with my teaching
- It's too different
- To do it properly my students will expect me to keep up with and use the latest tech
- Once all my content is up, they won't need me anymore




