Additional Information

This program is taught at the Berwick, Churchill and Mt Helen campus, with the option to complete online studies. Students must complete all the core compulsory courses within the program structure over 4 years (or part-time equivalent). Each course is usually worth 15 credit points.

A total of 480 credit points is compulsory to satisfy the program requirements of Initial Teacher Education (ITE) programs, as well as a minimum of 110 days professional experience.

You will also be required to successfully complete external Literacy and Numeracy tests prior to registration as a teacher. Please note that International Students are not eligible to study this program online.

Students will need to apply for a Working with Children Check (WWCC) card before commencing their program. A copy of the WWCC card must be supplied to the University prior to commencing professional experience placements, more information can be found at the WWCC website.

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Glossary

Advanced (Adv.):	Courses that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level courses
Co-requisite (CoR):	A course or courses that must be completed concurrently with the chosen course
Pre-requisite (PR):	A course or courses that must be completed prior to undertaking another course
Exclusion(s)(EX):	A course that is the equivalent to another course & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent course
CR:	Credit Point value
Introductory (Intro):	Courses that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level courses
Intermediate (Inter.):	Courses that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level courses
Major/Minor:	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
Semester:	Designated teaching period
