Important Enrolment Information

In order to qualify for the degree of Bachelor of Arts, students must satisfactorily complete a total of 360 credit points.

All students must complete a major (8 courses – 120CP) in one of the following disciplines:

- History
- Indigenous Studies
- Literature
- Media and Screen Studies
- Sociology
- Writing

Courses for the discipline major consists of:

- 1 x Introductory level course = 15 credit points (usually completed in 1st year)
- 2 x Intermediate level courses = 30 credit points (usually completed in 2nd year)
- 2 x Advanced level courses = 30 credit points (usually completed in 3rd year)
- 3 x additional courses at Introductory, Intermediate or Advanced level in the discipline = 45 credit points

Students also complete a minor (4 courses – 60CP) in one of the following disciplines:

- History
- Indigenous Studies
- Literature
- Media and Screen Studies
- Sociology
- Writing
- Criminal Justice
- Community and Human Services
- Education Studies

Courses for the discipline minor consists of:

- 1 x Introductory level course = 15 credit points (usually completed in 1st year)
- 3 x additional courses at Introductory, Intermediate or Advanced level in the discipline = 45 credit points

Students **must** complete the 4 core BA courses (60CP), 1 major of 8 courses (120CP) and 1 minor of 4 courses (60CP) in order to satisfy the requirements of the program.

Students may choose electives for their remaining courses. While most electives will be sourced from the Bachelor of Arts program, students will also be given the option of choosing electives from any Federation University undergraduate program as per yearly offerings and contingent on the student meeting the course pre-requisites.

Students may elect to complete a second major of 8 courses in lieu of electives and a minor.

Glossary

Advanced (Adv.):	Courses that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level courses
Co-requisite (CoR):	A course or courses that must be completed concurrently with the chosen course
CR:	Credit Point value
Exclusion (EX):	A course that is the equivalent to another course and so excludes students from repeating an equivalent course
Introductory (Intro):	Courses that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level courses
Intermediate (Inter.):	Courses that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level courses
Major/Minor:	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
Pre-Requisite(s) (PR):	A course or courses that must be completed prior to undertaking another course
Semester:	Designated teaching period
