All applicants are also required to submit a certified copy of their qualification (including a full transcript/statement of attainment).

Pathway/alternate entry

Students who have successfully completed a fourth year of university study may be eligible to apply for entry into the program with up to 120 credit points.

Entry requirements and exit points

- Undergraduate degree in any health discipline or equivalent; or
- Other university qualification and appropriate industry experience

You may exit the program and receive a Graduate Certificate of Health (Health Services Management) following the completion of 60 credit points or progress to the Graduate Diploma of Health (Health Services Management) following the completion of 120 points.
