Course Rules

Students must complete all the core compulsory units within the course structure over 3 years (or part-time equivalent).

Each unit is usually worth 15 credit points, except Professional Inquiry units which are 30 credit points.

A total of 360 credit points is compulsory to satisfy the course requirements of the Bachelor of Education Studies.

There are two streams available:

Stream 1: Complete 360 credit points comprising:

- 240 credit points for all Core Units; and
- 120 credit points from Advanced Standing

Stream 2: Complete 360 credit points comprising:

- 210 credit points for all Core Units; and
- 150 credit points from Advanced Standing

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Glossary

Co-requisite (CoR):	A unit or units that must be completed concurrently with the chosen unit
Pre-requisite (PR):	A unit or units that must be completed prior to undertaking another unit
Exclusion(s)(EX):	A unit that is the equivalent to another unit & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent unit
Introductory (Intro):	Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units
Intermediate (Inter.):	Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units
Advanced (Adv.):	Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units
Major/Minor:	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
Semester:	Designated teaching period
CR:	Credit Point value
