Join the dots from secondary school to university

The Year 12 subjects you choose play a crucial role in determining what you can study after you finish school, so start exploring your options early. Even if you haven't quite decided if university is for you, make sure you check the prerequisite subjects for all of the courses you are interested in to keep your options open.

Undergraduate course options

The two main types of courses at university are undergraduate and postgraduate. Undergraduate courses are for students who have never studied at university before, and are usually known as bachelor's degrees.

As a secondary school student, you will need to ensure any courses you are researching fit into the undergraduate category.

After you have completed your bachelor's degree and you are willing and capable to further your education you can look into postgraduate courses.

PREREQUISITES – WHAT ARE THEY?

Prerequisites are studies you **MUST** complete to be eligible for selection to a bachelor's degree. All university degrees clearly identify prerequisites that you must meet to be considered for entry, and some may even have a set ATAR score that you must achieve. Make sure you do your research and consider all your options when choosing your subjects for Year 12!

TAFE options

A range of quality vocational education and training options are also available. Advanced Diploma, Diploma and Certificate IV courses train you for supervisory and management positions. They also teach skills in professional, technical or creative fields, and may provide a pathway with credits into degree courses.

Alternatively, apprenticeship and traineeship training can lead to becoming a master of your trade. This can open many future career opportunities to a level you may never have thought possible.

Most TAFE courses do not stipulate formal entry requirements.

How do studies at university differ from school?

At university you choose what you want to study, and tailor your course to suit your interests.

At university you usually have two 12-week semesters rather than terms, and full time students study four units each semester. Most courses will have compulsory units, a major and some electives, but this can vary depending on the course you are studying. The assignments you do will vary depending on your units – some will have essays, some will have practical work or a placement, and some a mix of both, and most will have an exam at the end of the semester.

Lectures

A lecture is held in a theatre and can have anywhere from 15 to 500 students! Lectures have very little interaction – the lecturer will give a presentation over one or two hours while students take notes. You would expect to have one lecture per unit, per week.

Tutorials

Tutorials – or ‘tutes’ as they are commonly known – are for smaller groups of students to discuss the weekly topics with a tutor. You would have one tute per unit per week, usually running for one to two hours. Tutes usually involve a lot of conversation and groupwork.

Practicals/workshops/laboratory classes

Practicals (or ‘pracs’), workshops and laboratory classes (or ‘labs’) are mainly offered in the health and science areas of study. They can last from one to three hours, with students conducting experiments and hands on activities. Once you get to university, you are expected to be an independent learner. While your university teachers will be encouraging and supportive, it is not their job to check on your progress – you need to be able to manage your time by yourself.

Online learning

Online study at university is also an option for many courses.

Sample timetable for students studying a bachelor’s degree.

As a general guide, students are expected to complete 40 hours of study per week as a full-time load.

With 25 hours of scheduled class time for the Bachelor of Veterinary and Wildlife Science, the expectation is to complete a minimum of 15 hours of additional study outside class time. (Study length varies between degrees).

Celene will head to Florida in September 2023 for the Scientist Astronaut Program at the International Institute of Astronautical Sciences, preparing her to take part in future sub-orbital missions with Project PoSSUM (Polar Suborbital Science in the Upper Mesosphere). Celene has been supported to undertake this training through the Federation University Australia Foundation's Meredith Doig scholarship, and other sponsors.

"It's really exciting to be taking part in this immersive astronaut training program. In terms of my dream of getting to space, this is getting quite close," said Celene.

Celene chose to study at Federation University for its practical course, small class sizes, and student support. "The facilities at Federation are quite incredible for student experiences. As a physiotherapy student we use the Anatomage table, which is very practical and you get to see all the structures in a 3D format."

So far, Celene's clinical placements have included a hospital and private clinical practice. "You get to see how physios work in different environments and with different types of patients," said Celene.

After graduating from Federation University, Andrew worked as an assistant coach with Essendon, before being head-hunted by Port Adelaide.

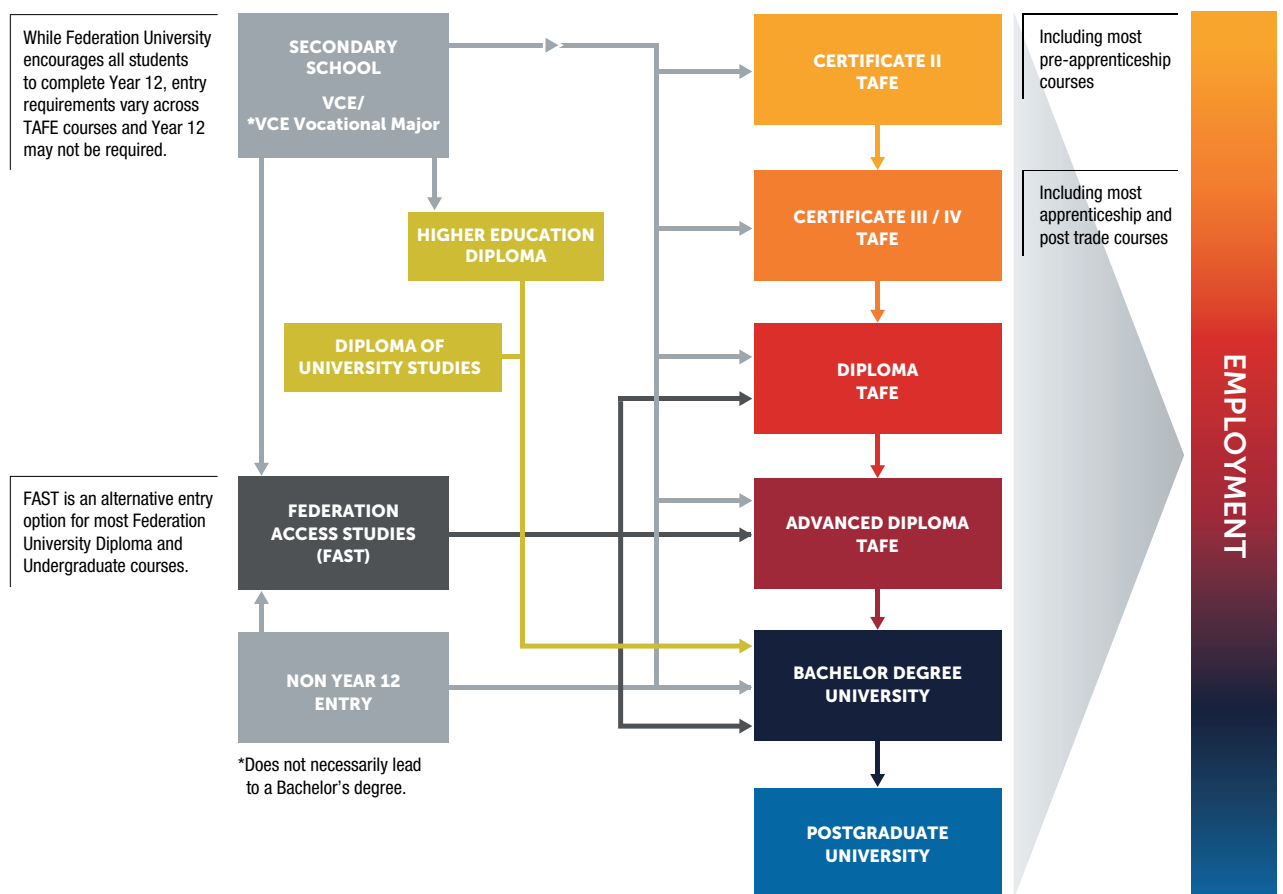
