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Additional Information

Completion of the TR5 program qualifies students to work as welfare/guidance officers in schools who can also teach psychology at secondary school level. The two majors are in welfare and psychology. Due to the complexity of the Community and Human Services field, TR5 has a major of 11 courses in Community and Human Services and a Major of 6 Psychology courses. Discipline courses are offered subject to availability and equivalent courses could be substituted. TR5 is also comprised of 16 education courses. All courses are 15 point credit courses.

TR5 is an Initial Teacher Education program and is accredited with VIT.

Glossary

Semester – designated teaching period

Pre-requisite (PR) – a course or courses that must be completed prior to undertaking another course

Co-requisite (CoR) – a course or courses that must be completed concurrently with the chosen course

Exclusion (EX) – a course that is the equivalent to another course and so excludes students from repeating an equivalent course

Major/Minor – the main subject area of study completed as part of a degree

Introductory (Intro) – Courses that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level courses

Intermediate (Inter.) – Courses that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level courses

Advanced (Adv.) – Courses that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level courses

CR – Credit point value
