# Entry requirements and exit points

To be eligible for the program, you must hold a Bachelor of Nursing (or equivalent). Entry into this program is contingent upon the candidates ability to demonstrate current and satisfactory registration with AHPRA as a Registered Nurse. You must also be practicing in a mental health nursing setting.

Exit points include:

- Graduate Diploma of Health (Mental Health Nursing) following completion of 120 credit points.
- Graduate Certificate in Health (Mental Health Nursing) following completion of 60 credit points.

Students who continue to Masters level can choose from two streams - Research Practice and Health Leadership.

Completion of the Master of Health (Mental Health Nursing) provides a pathway into Doctoral studies with Federation University.
