## **Course Requirements**

Students must complete all the core compulsory units within the course structure over 4 years (or part-time equivalent). Each unit is usually worth 15 credit points.

A total of 480 credit points is compulsory to satisfy the course requirements of Initial Teacher Education (ITE) courses, as well as a minimum of 80 days professional experience. You will also be required to successfully complete external Literacy and Numeracy tests prior to registration as a teacher.

Please note that International students are not eligible to study this course online.

Students will need to apply for a Working With Children Check (WWCC) card before commencing their course. A copy of the WWCC card must be supplied to the University prior to commencing professional experience placements. More information can be found at the WWCC website.

### Glossary

Co-requisite (CoR): A unit or units that must be completed concurrently with the chosen unit

**Pre-requisite (PR):** A unit or units that must be completed prior to undertaking another unit

**Exclusion(s)(EX):** A unit that is the equivalent to another unit & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent

unit

**Introductory (Intro):** Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units

Intermediate (Inter.): Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units

Advanced (Adv.): Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units

Major/Minor: The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree

Semester: Designated teaching period

CR: Credit Point value
