#### **Course Rules**

In order to qualify for the degree of Bachelor of Criminal Justice, students must satisfactorily complete a total of 360 credit points. All students must complete one of the following two options as part of their program:

**Option 1:** A Major consists of 6 courses (including the compulsory first year course) – students must complete 5 courses in either Behavioural Studies, Community and Human Services or Sociology plus the relevant core course in in first year.

**Option 2:** The Minor consists of 4 courses (including the compulsory first year course) – students completing this option must complete 3 courses in in either Behavioural Studies, Community and Human Services or Sociology, two elective course.

Students must complete a minimum of 90 points at advanced level (third year)

equivalent unit

**Introductory (Intro):** Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units

Intermediate (Inter.): Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units

Advanced (Adv.): Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units

Major/Minor: The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree

Semester: Designated teaching period

CR: Credit Point value
