Eligibility

This program is open to all Federation University undergraduate nursing students enrolled in the 3rd year of their Bachelor of Nursing degree and in the unit NURBN3034.

Dates

It is expected* that this three (3) week program will commence on Saturday 7 September 2024 toSunday 29 September 2024. *COVID-19 Safe and University travel safe guidelinespermitting.

Locations visited.

You will fly into Kathmandu, Nepal and stay 2 nights in Kathmandu during your orientation. The group will then transfer to the small town of Banepa, which is located approx. 1 hour east of Kathmandu. In Kathmandu, you will be staying at Dom Himalaya Hotel Paknajol Marg, Thamel, Kathmandu. In Banepa you will be staying at the OYO 242 Hotel Satyam.

Inclusions

Full international travel insurance, accommodation in Banepa and Kathmandu, clinical placement fees, field trips, most meals, local transport in Nepal and return airfare to and from Kathmandu (group travel to be arranged; all students to be on the same flight).

Cost

Final costs are still to be confirmed with flight costs and insurance costs currently being negotiated. It is expected that the trip will cost between \$5,200.00 and \$5,700.00 per student*.

Note: NOT included in this cost is passport and visa arrangements, some meals on days off, and personal expenses.

Financial support available

All participating Australian students will be able to access OS HELP up to the value of \$8,000 (a loan placed on your HECS bill). More Information is available at <u>OS-HELP Loan</u> Program.

- Participate in health promotion workshops with community health volunteers


Credit to your degree

next steps

Ready to go? Follow these steps and you're on your way*

Step 1	Check the entry requirements, which may include specific units (NURBN3034) or an appropriate previous study unit. Check that you are able to undertake this placement with the Placement office and the course co-ordinator.
Step 2	Check for any essential requirements that you need to complete in addition to your application. Essential requirements may include valid passports, appropriate vaccinations for your destination country and availability to travel at that time.
Step 3	Check that you are financially able to undertake this trip. Unfortunately, this year the Clinical placement Nursing tour is not externally supported. You will be able to get an OS-HELP loan (if you are an Australian citizen). You should apply to receive this loan at least one month before departure.
Step 4	Complete your <u>Expression of Interest (EOI)</u> to undertake this tour – (all applications are submitted on-line).
