Glossary

Co-requisite (CoR):	A unit or units that must be completed concurrently with the chosen unit
Pre-requisite (PR):	A unit or units that must be completed prior to undertaking another unit
Exclusion(s) (EX):	A unit that is the equivalent to another unit & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent unit
Introductory (Intro):	Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units
Intermediate (Inter.):	Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units
Advanced (Adv.):	Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units
Major/Minor:	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
Semester:	Designated teaching period
CR:	Credit Point value
