Develop advanced skills in community child and family health nursing with the ability to critically analyse and apply principles of primary healthcare.

Our program

The Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Services of Victoria builds partnerships with families and communities by collaboratively integrating with Allied Health and Early Childhood services. As a student, this program will provide you with evidence-based knowledge and skills to recognise the strength, vulnerabilities, physical, emotional and social factors affecting the diverse families in our local communities.

The course model is a combination of online, face-to-face block sessions and 300 hours of clinical placement.

Clinical placements can take place in a variety of settings including MCH centres, Mother Baby Units and Early Childhood Education Centers. Federation University has partnered with Casey, Cardinia and Greater Dandenong councils to support your clinical placement opportunities, although clinical placements can be undertaken at other local councils Victoria-wide.

Career opportunities

Your MCH qualifications will address an identified shortage in the Child and Family health workforce. Your qualifications will also allow further development of skills in specialty areas in both community and institutional workplaces.

Entry requirements

- Current registration with AHPRA as both a Registered Nurse (RN) and Midwife (RM); and
- Australian Bachelor's degree or equivalent; and
- A minimum of 12 months recent experience in both general nursing and midwifery.

Students who successfully complete the Graduate Diploma may be further eligible to apply for entry into the Federation University Master of Health program.
