8-WEEKS STUDY Unit: COOPC102X (with deferred COOPC200X placement and grade)	 Students complete 8 weeks of classroom learning typically in the 1st year of their course. Co-op placement COOPC200X will occur later in the course. COOPC102X will remain "open" with a deferred grade until co-op placement is completed, then COOPC102X and COOPC200X will be closed off together once a satisfactory 60-working days/450 hour placement has been completed. 			
12-WEEKS STUDY Unit: COOPC102X (no placement) Unit: COOP_1001	 This is a complete unit, no placement. Elective unit which may be undertaken anytime during a students' course with academic approval. After completion of COOPC102X, students may opt-in to undertake a co-op placement as an elective. 			
(no placement)	This is a complete unit, no placement.			
12-WEEKS PLACEMENT Unit/s: COOPC202X or COOP_2011 and 2012	Students to undertake 60 working days/12 weeks full-time (or 450 hours part-time equivalent) paid placement.
