The FAST Program consist of 4 courses (subjects). There are 3 compulsory courses and you choose the Maths elective that best suits your intended area of study.

Students select from either:

- FASTP1013 Mathematics and Introductory Statistics, which equips students for undertaking a wide range of Federation University degrees such as Nursing, Education, Business, Psychology and IT; or
- EDMTH1000 Introduction to Technical Maths equips students for undertaking Engineering and Mathematics degrees and may provide credit into Science and Education degrees.

If you intend to complete the program part-time it will take 12 months in the following sequence:

- Semester 1 FASTP1011 and FASTP1015
- Semester 2 ATSGC1369 and your chosen Maths elective (FASTP1013 or EDMTH1000)

Glossary

Advanced (Adv.): Courses that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level courses

Co-requisite (CoR): A course or courses that must be completed concurrently with the chosen course

Pre-requisite (PR): A course or courses that must be completed prior to undertaking another course

Exclusion(s) (EX): A course that is the equivalent to another course & so excludes students from repeating an

equivalent course

CR: Credit Point value

Introductory (Intro): Courses that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level courses

Intermediate (Inter.): Courses that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level courses

Major/Minor: The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree

Semester: Designated teaching period
