Glossary

Semester - designated teaching period

Pre-requisite (PR) – a course or courses that must be completed prior to undertaking another course

Co-requisite (CoR) – a course or courses that must be completed concurrently with the chosen course

Exclusion (EX) – a course that is the equivalent to another course and so excludes students from repeating an equivalent course

Major/Minor – the main subject area of study completed as part of a degree **Introductory (Intro)** – Courses that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level courses **Intermediate (Inter.)** – Courses that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level courses **Advanced (Adv.)** – Courses that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level courses **CR** – Credit point value
