Important Enrolment Information

In order to qualify for the degree of Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice, students must satisfactorily complete a total of 360 credit points. All students must complete one of the following two options as part of their program:

Option 1: A Major consists of 6 courses (including the compulsory first year course) – students must complete 5 courses in either Behavioural Studies, Community and Human Services or Social Science plus the relevant core course in in first year.

Option 2: The Minor consists of 4 courses (including the compulsory first year course) – students completing this option must complete 3 courses in in either Behavioural Studies, Community and Human Services or Social Science, one elective course and SOSCI3005.

Glossary

Advanced (Adv.):	Courses that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level courses
Co-requisite (CoR):	A course or courses that must be completed concurrently with the chosen course
Pre-requisite (PR):	A course or courses that must be completed prior to undertaking another course
Exclusion(s)(EX):	A course that is the equivalent to another course & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent course
CR:	Credit Point value
Introductory (Intro):	Courses that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level courses
Intermediate (Inter.):	Courses that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level courses
Major/Minor:	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
Semester:	Designated teaching period
