# **Coronavirus response - Federation University Australia**

Wednesday 22 September 2021

Dear Student,

The Victorian Government has announced that lockdown restrictions will be lifted in Ballarat from 11.59pm on Wednesday 22 September.

Our Ballarat campus will reopen on Tuesday 28 September under the same regional Victorian restrictions as our Gippsland and Wimmera campuses, which remain open for up to 25 per cent of staff and approved student activity.

This means there is limited on-campus activity and learning will remain remote except for practicals and laboratory classes for certain groups of students in accordance with the Victorian Government <u>COVIDSafe Settings</u>. Please read the detailed advice for regional Victorian campuses below.

Lockdown restrictions are unchanged for Melbourne and our **Berwick Campus remains closed**, aside from limited authorised activity for staff and students with an approved work or study permit, as per the current arrangements.

Brisbane Campus remains open and is unaffected by the Victorian restrictions.

# Regional Victoria restrictions and impact on Ballarat, Gippsland and Wimmera campus operations

- Higher education, TAFE and HDR studies continue online, aside from limited practical on-campus activities, aligned to the authorised worker list.
- Students will be contacted directly if applicable to them. HDR candidates should continue working from home and seek guidance from their supervisory team and/or their School HDR coordinator.
- Authorised worker / student permits are required for students travelling from or to Melbourne metropolitan areas for authorised work or study (permit application process below). Permits are not required for students living and working or studying in regional Victoria.
- <u>Placements in regional Victoria for regional residents only</u> depend on workplace arrangements for employers. All onsite placements involving Melbourne metropolitan area residents or businesses located in metro Melbourne are by permit only, aligned to the authorised worker list.
- VCAL and Ballarat Tech School resume on campus from Tuesday 28 September
- Libraries, retail, hospitality, fitness centres, pools and community sport – reopen but with limits in place.
- Childcare open for regional Victorian children
- Childcare workers and school teachers COVID test requirements any childcare workers and school teachers (or students in these placements), who travel from Melbourne metro areas to regional Victoria to work, must get twice-weekly PCR tests, as well as authorised work permits. The Victorian Government has also announced that all Victorian childcare workers and school teachers must be fully vaccinated by 29 November. Students and staff who fall under this requirement will contacted directly about this in coming weeks.

# Permit application process for students travelling from or to Melbourne metropolitan areas for authorised work or study

Students who are required to attend essential classes or have a placement, are required to have an authorised placement work permits.

**Action Required:** To be considered for a permit, please complete the <u>permit form</u> (pdf, 217kb).

Important information about completing your form:

- You must provide us with your scheduled placement or class hours in Table 2 of the form:
- If you are a nursing student and have a roster, you MUST also submit your roster with the form.
- We recognise that you are a student, however for this form you are to complete the 'Employee' sections and hours of work.
- If your hours/roster changes, you will be required to complete a new form with the revised hours.

Once you have fully completed the form, including the 'hours of attendance' in Table 2, location and signature, submit to the Work Integrated Learning (WIL) team via email: <u>wil@federation.edu.au</u>.

The WIL team will then check the details, sign the form and email it to you. **Please** allow at least one business day for your permit to be processed.
