# Why enrol in **Federation Access Studies program (FAST)?**

**FAST** is a single semester program that will teach you how to adapt the skills you already have to study effectively, including how to write for academic purposes, research, and use university systems, and how to apply all these skills to your studies.

This program is an ideal pathway if you don't have an academic background or the necessary entry requirements to start a degree. It's also a great stepping stone if you have a TAFE Diploma or Certificate IV and wish to progress to university studies.

**FAST** also offers an elective maths course for students who want to study an Engineering degree. Successful completion of the Introduction to Technical Maths course satisfies the entry requirements to apply for an Engineering degree.

**Once you have successfully completed FAST, you are guaranteed a place in one of Federation University's undergraduate degrees.**

# Am I eligible?

## Entry requirements

### Current Year 12 applicants

**Applicants should turn 18 in the year of commencement OR have completed Year 12 or equivalent.**

Year 12 applicants will be ranked based on their ATAR and ATAR Adjustment Factors – e.g. Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) and Subject Adjustments.

**Federation Access Studies (FAST):** A study score of at least 18 in any English. For the Mathematics unit FASTP1013, the prerequisite is Year 10 Mathematics (or equivalent). Students who have completed Foundation Mathematics are able to enter this stream.

**Federation Access Studies (FAST) for Engineering and Mathematical Science:** A study score of at least 18 in any English and either satisfactory completion of Units 1 and 2: Mathematical Methods or Specialist Mathematics or satisfactory completion of Units 3 and 4: General Mathematics. This stream applies for entry into any Federation University degree that has the prerequisite of Mathematical Methods or Specialist Mathematics and requires successful completion of EDMTH1000.

*Any applicants who have not met the English or Maths prerequisites through Year 12 results (e.g. VCE VM, VCAL or un-scored VCE) will be required to complete a literacy or numeracy test to determine their eligibility for admission. To qualify for entry into the FAST Engineering and Mathematical Science stream, applicants complete the Technical Maths entry test.*

### Non-Year 12 applicants

**Admission criteria for applicants with a higher education study**

Applicants should turn 18 in the year of commencement OR have completed Year 12 or equivalent.

Applicants who have previously completed Year 12, TAFE Diploma or Certificate IV are eligible to enter the program without completing a literacy and numeracy test.

Applicants who have not completed Year 12, a TAFE Diploma or Certificate IV will be required to complete a literacy and numeracy test to determine their eligibility for admission. For entry into the Engineering and Mathematical Science stream, applicants need to complete the Technical Maths entry test.





# What's in the detail?

## Program information

### Fees

There are no tuition fees for this enabling program. Domestic students eligible for a Commonwealth Supported Place are exempt from paying the student contribution amount.

### Other fees

You will need to pay the [Student Services and Amenities Fee \(SSAF\)](#).

### Other study costs

You can also expect to pay general costs for books, equipment and stationery of up to \$250 during the program.

### Study load

Contact hours for on-campus students are: full-time = 13 hours per week, part-time = 7 hours per week. In addition, students should allow extra time for independent study and completion of assessment tasks.

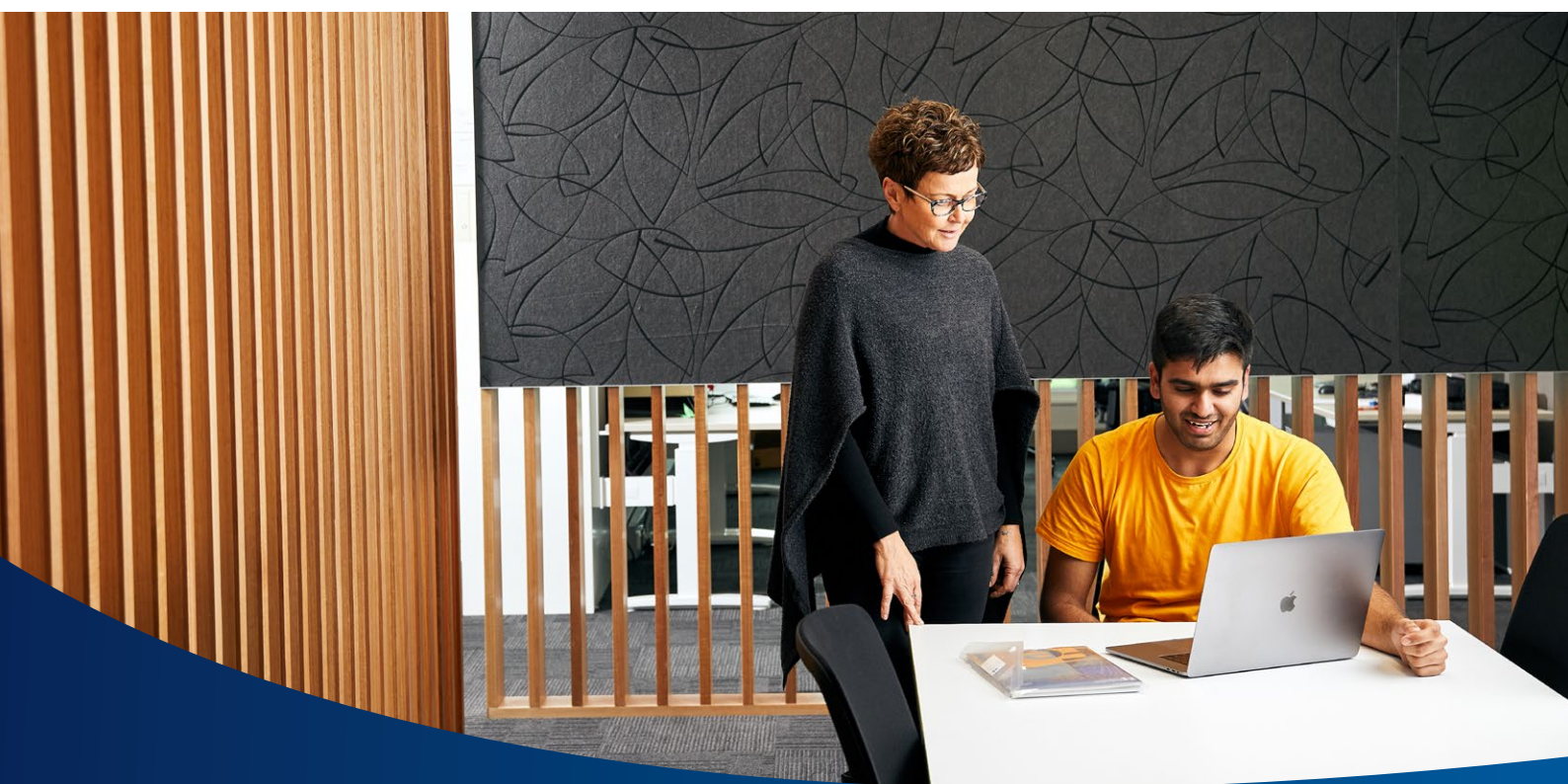
Online students: Online students may study entirely online without attending classes. Online times are available each week for regular access to staff. As a guide, students should allow up to 10 hours a week per unit. If you intend to enrol in FAST as an online student alongside full-time work and/or carer responsibilities, we encourage part-time study.

# We're a Co-operative University - what does that mean?

The Federation University Australia Co-operative Model – real workplaces, real projects, and real career opportunities.

Co-operative education, or 'co-op' is a well-established international model that prepares students for their future careers by linking them to workplaces as a core part of their degree through co-operative relationships with industry.

Federation Co-op puts students at the heart of education and industry. The model gets students work and world ready, through direct connection to employers, paid placements, career preparation and workplace skill development.

Federation is offering Co-op degrees from 2024, across Science, Engineering, Engineering Technology, Business, IT and IT Professional Practice. Between now and the end of 2025, we will embed Co-op across our suite of Federation University and TAFE courses, with delivery commencing in 2026.

A Co-op course incorporates employer and industry engagement from start to finish. It means that the program is co-designed, co-developed, co-delivered, co-assessed and co-accredited with input from employers and industry.

Our industry stakeholders are excited about Federation Co-op as it addresses skill shortages by inviting them to collaborate on our courses, to identify the real skills that our students need to succeed in their chosen industry. For our communities, Federation Co-op will drive the growth of our regional economies by developing talented local graduates who understand exactly what our regional businesses need.

## What does the co-op model offer students?

You will benefit from working on projects in real workplaces, delivering practical outcomes for industry, government, and not-for-profits, with the work experience you gain contributing to your academic record and completion of your course.

Every student will complete Co-operative Experiential Learning (formerly known as Work Integrated Learning), which includes structured workplace skills and accredited learning in a workplace, with options for paid placements, cadetships, internships, or working on real projects on campus.

Every Federation Co-op course will:

- include transferable skills as well as technical skills to prepare you for your career
- include at least 60 days of workplace learning that contributes directly to your course credits
- give you the opportunity to work alongside industry leaders and build your professional network while you study.

You'll also be provided with a range of opportunities to suit your goals and needs, including:

- shorter 'learning in the workplace' opportunities
- team-based projects for an industry partner
- connections with local and international opportunities, with access to major national and global employers opening up opportunities for travel.

At Federation University, our co-operative education model will provide you with real, meaningful work experience in workplaces using the latest technology, no matter what course you choose.

## Co-operative Experiential Learning

We provide Co-operative Experiential Learning opportunities (formerly known as Work Integrated Learning) across all our courses. These workplace learning opportunities can be real or simulated, occurring in the workplace, at university, online or face to face.

Our paid Co-op placements are a specific form of Co-operative Experiential Learning that is unique to Federation University. Every student completes a minimum of 60 days' paid placement relevant to your course – contributing directly to course credits – either full time over one semester, part time over an extended period or in blocks embedded into your subjects. Our Co-op model ensures you graduate both work and world-ready with the opportunity to accelerate your career.

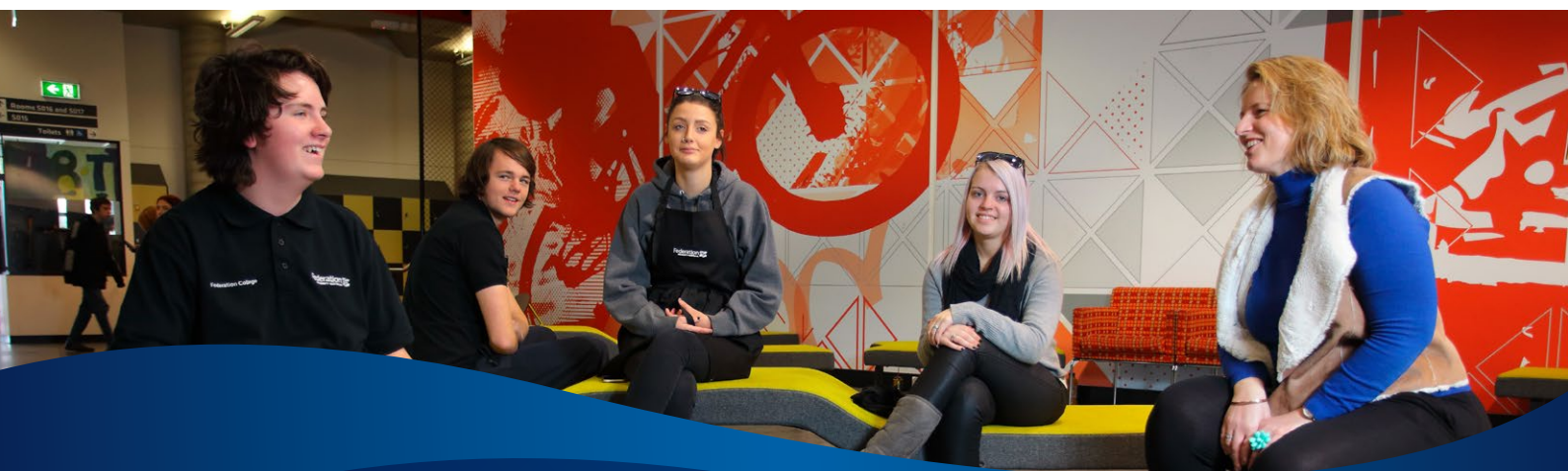
