
Who I am:

- 5. We must be evidence-based.





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Example: Student-Focused Learning


Effective Practice includes:

- 1. Are inclusive, & create a sense of belonging;
- 2. Respects and supports students as individuals;
- 3. Uses clear and plain language;
- 4. Offers students flexibility, variety & choice;
- 5. Scaffolds students' learning.
