### Important Enrolment Information

In order to qualify for the degree of Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice, students must satisfactorily complete a total of 360 credit points. All students must complete one of the following two options as part of their program:

**Option 1:** A Major consisting of 8 courses from one of the following study areas: Sociology, Community and Human Services, Behavioural Studies, or IT Security.

**Option 2:** Two Minors of 4 courses each from the following study areas: Indigenous Studies, Sociology, Writing, Community and Human Services, Behavioural Studies or IT Security.

Additionally:

Students must successfully complete CRJUS 1285 and CRJUS 1287 prior to commencing a second or third year Criminal Justice courses, with the exception of CRJUS 2475, which is offered in first year second semester. Students can take a 2nd year course in their major or minor if they have not as yet passed CRJUS1285 and CRJUS1287.

Students must complete a minimum of 90 points at advanced (third year level).

<b>Advanced (Adv.):</b>	Courses that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level courses
<b>Co-requisite (CoR):</b>	A course or courses that must be completed concurrently with the chosen course
<b>Pre-requisite (PR):</b>	A course or courses that must be completed prior to undertaking another course
<b>Exclusion(s)(EX):</b>	A course that is the equivalent to another course & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent course
<b>CR:</b>	Credit Point value
<b>Introductory (Intro):</b>	Courses that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level courses
<b>Intermediate (Inter.):</b>	Courses that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level courses
<b>Major/Minor:</b>	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
<b>Semester:</b>	Designated teaching period
