Important Enrolment Information

This program is delivered sequentially over the course of two years fulltime, or part-time equivalent. Approximately 6 to 8 weeks is allocated to the delivery of each course within the program, with each class taking place fortnightly on alternating Fridays; details of the timetable will be published in Moodle prior to the commencement of each course. Each course within the program is typically worth 15 credit points each, with the exception of Field Placement courses worth 45 credit points each.

For students wishing to apply for course credits and/or recognition of prior learning (RPL), please ensure that you do so prior to the commencement of this program. Please see the Federation University Australia website for further information regarding this process:

This program is provisionally accredited by the Australian Association of Social Workers (AASW). Upon successful completion of this program, students will be eligible to apply for AASW memberships.

Professional experience field education placements take place at the end of both the first and second years. This professional experience provides the minimum supervised practice requirement (2 X 70 days = 140 days total). Some applicants may be eligible to apply for credit/RPL for some or the entire first field placement, subject to conditions.

Glossary

Semester – designated teaching period

Pre-requisite (PR) – a course or courses that must be completed prior to undertaking another course

Co-requisite (CoR) – a course or courses that must be completed concurrently with the chosen course

Exclusion (EX) – a course that is the equivalent to another course and so excludes students from repeating an equivalent course

Major/Minor – the main subject area of study completed as part of a degree

Introductory (Intro) – Courses that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level courses

Intermediate (Inter.) – Courses that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level courses

Advanced (Adv.) – Courses that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level courses

CR – Credit point value

BER – Berwick campus offering location

MTH – Mt Helen campus offering location
