

STATUTE 3.2-THE DEPUTY CHANCELLOR

1. The Council may elect one or more persons to be Deputy Chancellors.
2. A Deputy Chancellor shall hold office subject to retaining the confidence of the Council for a term of two years and shall be eligible for re-election.
3. When the office of Deputy Chancellor is vacant or all elected Deputy Chancellors resign before completing their terms of office, the Council shall, as soon as practicable thereafter, elect a Deputy Chancellor.
4. Where the term of office of a Deputy Chancellor is about to expire, the Council shall, unless it resolves otherwise, elect a new Deputy Chancellor at the Council meeting immediately preceding the date of retirement.
5. The Council may make regulations governing the election of persons to the office of Deputy Chancellor.
6. (1) The Council may remove the Deputy Chancellor from office in accordance with the procedure in Schedule 1, Sub-clause 3(3) of the Act if at least two-thirds of the Council members are satisfied that:
 - (a) the Deputy Chancellor no longer holds the confidence of the Council;
and
 - (b) the Deputy Chancellor has failed to comply with his or her responsibilities as Deputy Chancellor and/or as a member of Council.
- (2) If the Council decides to remove the Deputy Chancellor from office in accordance with sub-section (1) above, the Council must as soon as practicable give the Deputy Chancellor written notice of the decision to invoke the procedure under Schedule 1, Sub-clause 3(3) of the Act.
- (3) If the Deputy Chancellor is removed from office at a meeting of the Council in accordance with Schedule 1, Sub-clause 3(3) of the Act, the Deputy Chancellor will immediately cease to hold office as Deputy Chancellor and as a member of Council.
7. (1) The Council may at any time make Regulations, not inconsistent with this Statute, prescribing all matters which by this Statute are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to this Statute and by later Regulation revoke or amend any such Regulations.
- (2) Regulations made under this Statute shall be promulgated by being exhibited on the official notice boards of the University and after being so promulgated shall remain so exhibited for at least fourteen days during which time the University is operating.
