Glossary

Advanced (Adv.): Courses that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level courses

Co-requisite (CoR): A course or courses that must be completed concurrently with the chosen course

Pre-requisite (PR): A course or courses that must be completed prior to undertaking another course

Exclusion(s)(EX): A course that is the equivalent to another course & so excludes students from repeating an

equivalent course

CR: Credit Point value

Introductory (Intro): Courses that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level courses **Intermediate (Inter.):** Courses that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level courses

Major/Minor: The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree

Semester: Designated teaching period
