## Program Requirements

Students must complete all the core compulsory courses within the program structure over 4 years (or part-time equivalent).

Students will also be required to complete a total of **twelve discipline elective courses** across **two areas of study**. Students also complete **two Curriculum courses** in each Major study area for a total of four (see below).

Each course is usually worth 15 credit points.

A total of 480 credit points is compulsory to satisfy the program requirements of Initial Teacher Education (ITE) programs, as well as a minimum of 80 days professional experience. You will also be required to successfully complete external Literacy and Numeracy tests prior to registration as a teacher.

Please note that International Students are not eligible to study this program online.

Students will need to apply for a Working with Children Check (WWCC) card before commencing their program. A copy of the WWCC card must be supplied to the University prior to commencing professional experience placements. More information can be found at the WWCC website.

### Major Discipline Electives

It is a requirement that Pre-Service Teachers (PSTs) complete:

- Two Major Studies of six discipline elective courses each (for a total of 12 courses) from two discipline sequence/study areas

*plus*

- Two Curriculum courses in each Major area of study (for a total of 4 courses).

## Glossary

<b>Advanced:</b>	Courses that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level courses
<b>Co-requisite:</b>	A course or courses that must be completed concurrently with the chosen course
<b>Exclusion:</b>	A course that is the equivalent to another course and so excludes students from repeating an equivalent course
<b>Introductory (Intro):</b>	Courses that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level courses
<b>Intermediate (Inter.):</b>	Courses that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level courses
<b>Major/Minor:</b>	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
<b>Pre-Requisite:</b>	A course or courses that must be completed prior to undertaking another course
<b>Semester:</b>	Designated teaching period
