

STATUTE 8.3-UNIVERSITY CENTRES

1. The Council, on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor, may establish University Centres, the objects of which are incidental or conducive to the objects of the University.
2. Without limiting the generality of section 1, the Council may establish University Centres, the objects of which include one or more of the following objects:
 - (a) providing facilities for study and education;
 - (b) undertaking research, development, consultancy and other services for industrial or commercial organisations, public bodies or individuals;
 - (c) aiding and engaging in the development, promotion and use of the results of university research;
 - (d) preparing, publishing or distributing literary or artistic work, audio or audio-visual material or computer software;
 - (e) seeking or encouraging gifts to the University or its students;
 - (f) promoting or assisting drama, music or the visual arts.
3. The objects, terms of reference, composition, administration, funding and reporting responsibilities of each Centre shall be determined by Council from time to time.
4.
 - (1) The University Council may at any time make Regulations, not inconsistent with this Statute, prescribing all matters which by this Statute are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to this Statute and by later Regulation revoke or amend any such Regulations.
 - (2) Regulations made under this Statute shall be promulgated by being exhibited on official notice boards, including the Home Page of the University and after being so promulgated shall remain so exhibited for at least fourteen days during which time the University is operating.
