Subject: Coronavirus Update – Victorian Federation campuses closed until Thursday 18 February Friday, 12 February 2021 3:23:00 PM

A short time ago, Premier Andrews announced, on advice from the Chief Health Officer, and after a meeting of relevant Cabinet committees and the full Cabinet, that from 11:59pm tonight all of Victoria will go to Stage 4 restrictions for five days until 11.59pm Wednesday 17 February, when the government will review the decision.

The snap announcement to impose stage 4 restrictions is described by the Premier as a "short, sharp circuit-breaker" made in an effort to contain the Holiday Inn COVID cluster, which grew to 13 cases overnight.

The restrictions include the following.

- Victorians will only be allowed to leave their homes for four reasons:
 - shopping for essentials goods
 - care giving and urgent medical needs
 - essential work and school only for the children of essential workers, and
 - exercise with household members only.
- Masks must be worn everywhere outside of your home (indoors and outdoors).
- There is no travel allowed beyond five kilometres of your home.
- Higher education, TAFE and schools will be closed but childcare will remain open.

The COVID-19 Transition Control Group met this afternoon to discuss the impact of this announcement.

As a result, Federation University and Federation TAFE campuses will close, as of 11:59pm tonight until Thursday 18 February.

Key advice to Federation staff:

 All staff must work from home, aside from a very small number of approved essential workers

- No on-campus events or activities involving students can go ahead until next Thursday – pending government advice next week on restrictions being lifted
- There is no TAFE and trade education until next Thursday (pending the lifting of restrictions)
- Fitness centres, community sport and swimming pools will be closed, hospitality will be takeaway only
- The TCG will contact Commercial Services and FedLiving directly to discuss what these announcements mean for its operations.
