### Glossary

**Co-requisite (CoR):** A unit or units that must be completed concurrently with the chosen unit

**Pre-requisite (PR):** A unit or units that must be completed prior to undertaking another unit

**Exclusion(s) (EX):** A unit that is the equivalent to another unit & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent unit

**Introductory (Intro):** Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units

<b>Intermediate (Inter.):</b>	Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units
<b>Advanced (Adv.):</b>	Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units
<b>Major/Minor:</b>	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
<b>Semester:</b>	Designated teaching period
<b>CR:</b>	Credit Point value
