Beyond academics, I'm deeply involved in community service, from improving school sanitation to facilitating radio programs for student learning during lockdowns. If elected, I'll focus on:


- Sustainability: Implementing eco-friendly practices and advocating for renewable energy sources.


My strength and confidence came from the community I join, I aim to build closer ties to the local communities and create new opportunities to develop useful skills.
